### **New Photo Service Policy**

Effective January 2, 2018, RIWS will be implementing a new photo service policy.


Given the time and effort that goes into the image editing process, we will be charging an additional \$3 per image for any edits beyond cropping and exposure.

Please be aware that a digital image cannot not truly replicate that of a painting. While our staff is trained to deliver high quality results, we cannot guarantee the level of quality produced in a high end photography studio.

We encourage you to use this service for our Open Juried Show submissions. RIWS staff will happily walk you through the online submission process at no additional cost.

# **New Art Work Pick Up Policy**

Effective January 2, 2018, RIWS will be implementing a new procedure for pick up of artist works. Artists will now have two weeks from the day after a show's end to pick up their works. Works left in storage beyond the two week pick up period will be charged at \$5 per week per piece. This is to ensure that we keep the studio free for photography services and compliant with fire safety rules.
